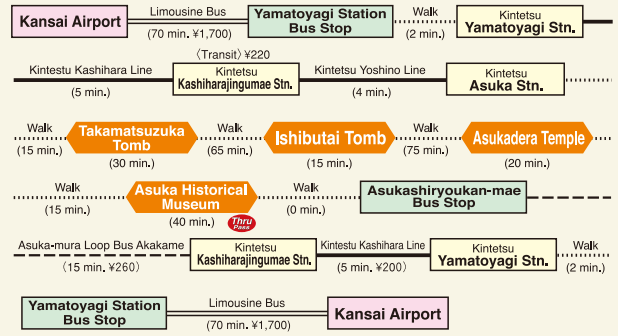
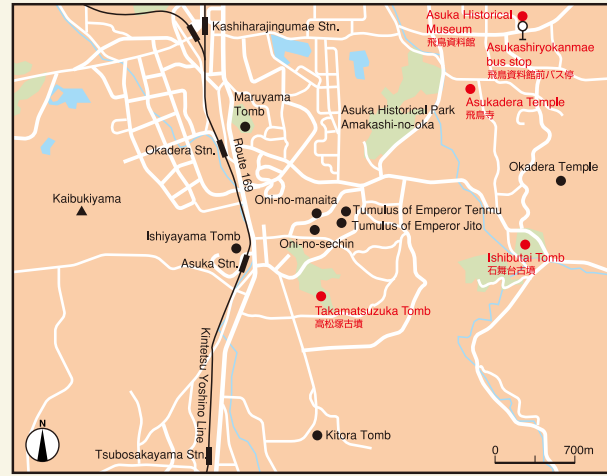

Ancient burial mounds lie quietly in an idyllic rural setting.



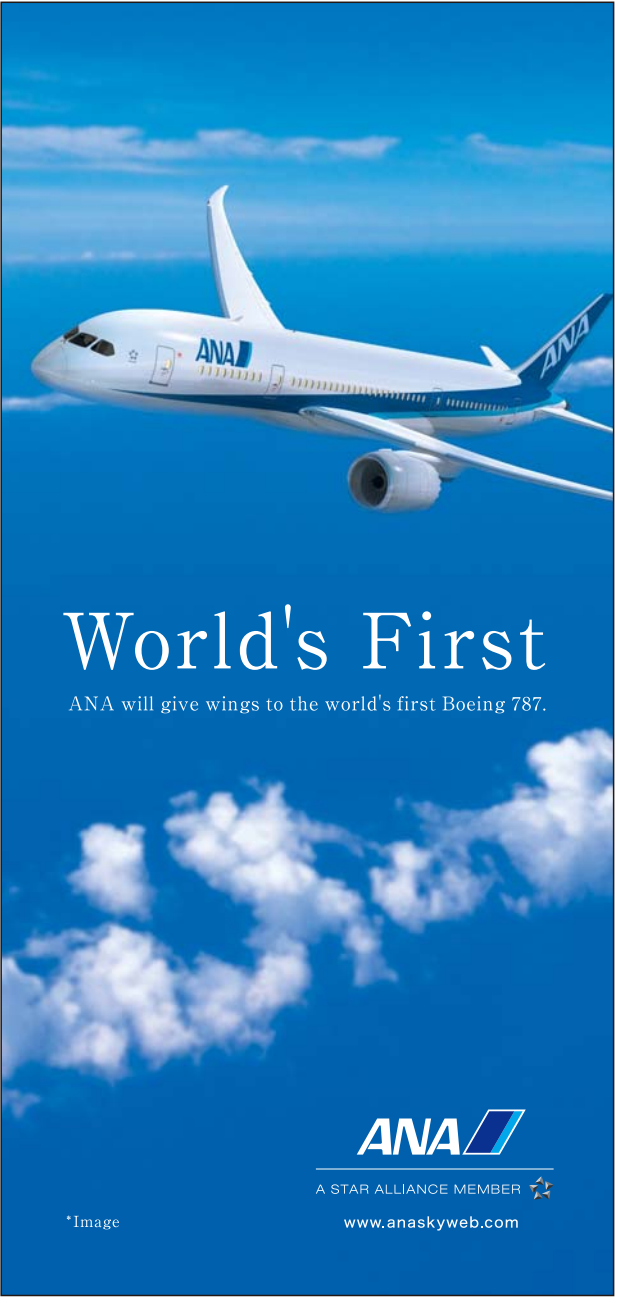

**Points of Interest**



**Ishibutai Tomb (Burial Mound)**  
 The Ishibutai burial mound is 19.1 meters in total length, 7.7 meters high, and is estimated to weigh more than 75 tons, making it the largest corridor-style stone chamber in Japan. Its name derives from the folklore that on a moonlit night a fox transformed into a beautiful woman and danced on top of the stone.  
 ● Open: 8:30a.m. - 5:00p.m. ● Open everyday yr round.  
 ● Admission: Adult: ¥250, High School Students: ¥200, Junior High School Students: ¥150, Elementary School Children: ¥100  
 ● Access: Kintetsu Kashiharajingumae Stn. → Adjacent to the terminal stop of the bus for Okadera Temple ● TEL: (0744)54-4577(Asuka-mura)

**Asuka Historical Museum**  
 View ancient items excavated from the Takamatsuzuka and Kitora burial mounds and other archaeological excavations in Asuka, as well as reconstructions and other exhibits. The museum holds many of Japan's oldest architectural materials, including valuable objects that had been buried within the central foundation stone of the pagoda at Asukadera temple.  
 ● Closed: Mon., (Tue. if it falls on a national holiday)  
 ● Admission: ¥260  
 ● Access: Adjacent to Asuka-shiryoukanmae (Historical Museum) bus stop
